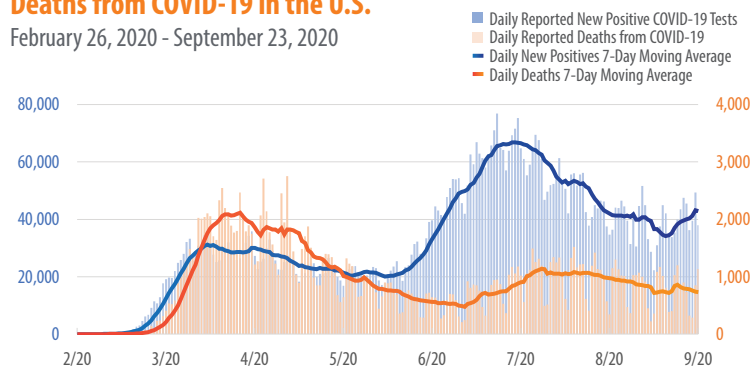

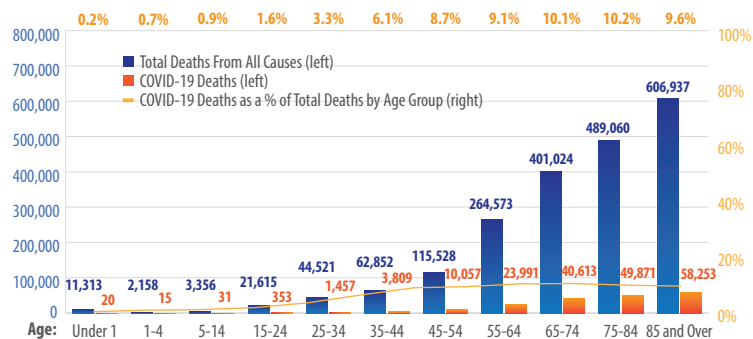

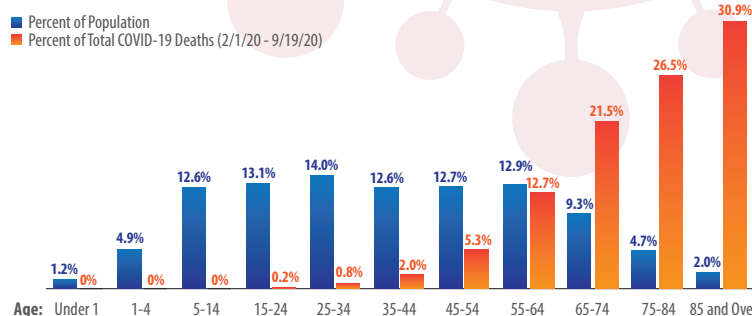

COVID-19 Deaths by Age vs. Share of Population in the U.S.

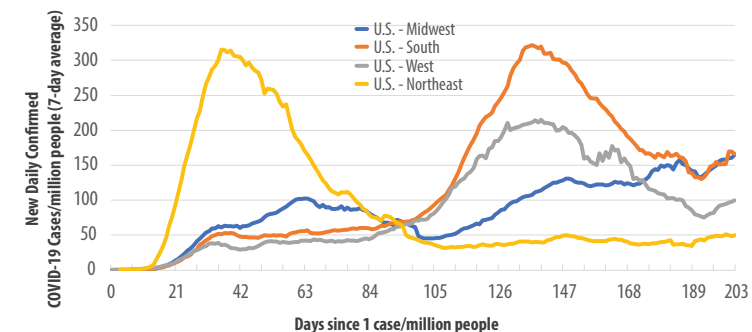

As of September 23, 2020

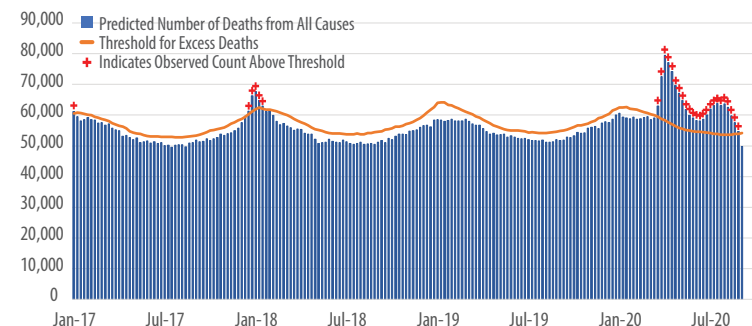

The CDC estimates that **for every reported positive COVID-19 test there are another 11 other COVID-19 infections, with an estimated range from 6 to 24.**² This would mean **41.4 million to 165.6 million people in the US have been infected with COVID-19** with the best guess being 75.9 million people or 23% of the population.³
